Twenty-fifth Annual George N. Tuerck Competition Rules

<u>Eligibility</u>

- The competition is open to student musicians, eleventh grade or younger, who play orchestral instruments, including piano and harp.
- Youth contestants do not need to be Youth Orchestra members to participate. However, youth who audition for the Tuerck must be **one** of the following to be eligible:
 - a. An Illinois resident of the counties surrounding Belleville or
 - b. A student of an Illinois music teacher in the counties surrounding Belleville or
 - c. A former or current member of the Belleville Philharmonic Youth Orchestra.
- Winners awarded prizes at the 2023 competition are not eligible to compete unless it is on a different instrument.
- Musicians not eligible for this competition for any reason, including age or geographic location, are encouraged to participate in the Belleville Philharmonic's Stars of Tomorrow Competition.

Repertoire and Competition

- Musicians should prepare one complete movement of a standard concerto or a composition for solo
 instrument and orchestra. The Tuerck committee may consider other selections with prior approval
 from the Youth Orchestra Director, Chris Gass. If you have questions or want prior consent for a song,
 please email <u>byo@bellevillephilharmonic.org</u>.
- Competitors arrange for piano accompanists for the audition and provide music for their chosen piano accompanist. If you need an accompanist, please email <u>byo@bellevillephilharmonic.org</u> for a list.
- Students need to bring <u>three</u> copies of their selections for the judges.
- Memorizing the musical selection for the competition is **preferred**, **but not required**. Winners must play the same solo at the concert as at the audition.
- The Tuerck committee will schedule competition times at the Belleville Philharmonic Hall. Committee members will inform contestants of their competition time. Organizers will make every effort to accommodate the preferred schedule.

Competition Winners

- The number of recipients chosen is up to the quality and quantity of the competitors, the award funds available that year from the Tuerck Scholarship Foundation, and the judges' discretion.
- The winner must be available to rehearse with the youth orchestra and perform at the Tuerck Memorial Concert, typically held the first weekend in December. If orchestral accompaniment is not available, or the difficulty of the piece does not allow it, a winning contestant will perform at the Tuerck Memorial Concert with piano accompaniment. BPS will present winners with their certificates and monetary scholarship awards at the Tuerck Memorial Concert after their performance. Judges' decisions are final. Winners will be notified of the results within two weeks after the competition.
